The anti-ragging committee of Bijanbari Degree College held a meeting with the 1st semester students on 19/September/2022 to spread awareness about the issue of ragging.

Minutes of the meeting:

1. The 1st semester students were welcomed by the teachers and each member of the anti-ragging cell were introduced to the students. The students were told about the existence of the anti-ragging cell of the college and how it can help them in the future, if need be.

An introductory speech on the issue of ragging was given by Adit Pariyar (I.Q.A.C coordinator). For general information to all Students, the following points were explained regarding what constitutes ragging -

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks

assigned to an individual or a group of students.

f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students .

g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.

h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher.

2. If any 1st semester students faced any sort of harassment from their seniors or fellow students, they were to report of it, to the Principal/T.I.C or to the anti-ragging cell.

3. The UGC guidelines 2009 and the Supreme Court Judgement of 8/May/2009 regarding the issue of ragging was read out in a jist. According to the UGC Regulations (No : UGC-Rag/C/96(15)/SCHE/2009) circulated on April 13, 2009, ragging in Higher Educational Institutions is strictly prohibited and totally banned, and anyone found guilty of ragging is liable to be punished in any one or more than one way such as Cancellation of admission or expulsion from college, Suspension from attending classes or collective punishment , when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers

4. The students were encouraged to participate in a healthy, encouraging and cooperative learning exercise in college.

The meeting ended with the message that the college teachers and the administration was always there to help the students.
